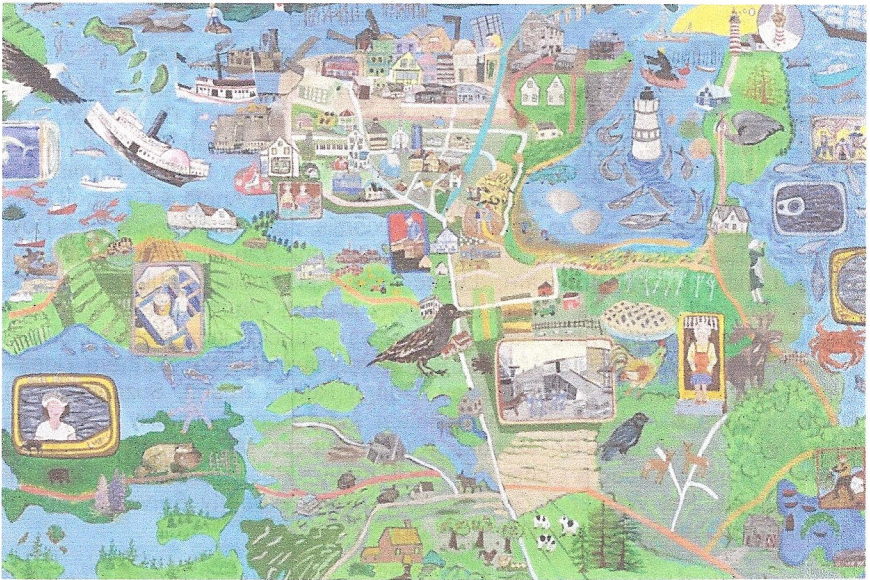

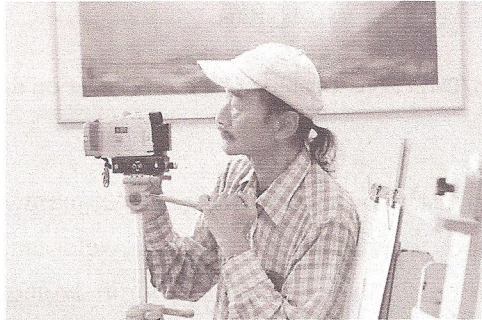

The film features local community members and artists from far and near, their creative philosophies, and their artwork.

Jon Wing Lum is an award winning filmmaker working in documentaries, features and television for over 50 years. He was born in New York City, and started out as an editor, mentored by Jean Oser and Paul Falkenberg. His work has been seen on PBS and all the major networks. He is considered one of the pioneers in "Catalytic Cinema" devoting himself to projects that bring about meaningful social change such as: "Plain Folk", an historical series aired on public television about little known minority persons and their contributions to American history, and "Save Chinatown", a documentary which witnessed the impact of urban renewal on a small immigrant community. He has also worked on numerous art films featuring Buckminster Fuller, Garcia Lorca, Henri Matisse, Jasper Johns, Louis Kahn and Willem de Kooning. In addition to receiving grants from the National Endowment of the Arts his films have been nominated for two Academy Awards and have won over 150 awards in American and International film festivals. His latest endeavor highlights the Artist-in-Residence program of "Lubec Arts Alive" in Washington County, Maine.
